Host Plants: low-growing plants in the aster family.

Diet: nectars of asters and lantana.

Host Plants: sugarberry.
Diet: tree sap, rotting fruit, dung.

Habitat: open, moist areas, edges of ponds, weedy fields.

Host Plants: wild petunias, bacopa, matchhead, white hyssop.

Diet: nectar from Spanish needles.

<u>Habitat</u>: pastures, open fields, subtropical forest. <u>Host Plant</u>: passion vine <u>Diet</u>: nectar from lantana, Spanish's needle, cordias.

Habitat: open woodlands, clearings, fencerows, swamps.
Host Plants: red oak, white oak.
Diet: nectar from dogbane, buttonbush, sneezeweed.

Host Plants: partridge pea.

Diet: nectar from pentas, azaleas, autumn sage, Mexican sage.
