

<u>Habitat</u>: rivers, lake edges, marshes, saltwater seacoasts, and swamps


<u>Diet</u>: reptiles, amphibians, small mammals, aquatic invertebrates

#### **Watching for Wildlife**

Tips on animal viewing

- <u>Stay Quiet</u>: Many animals have the ability to hear sounds that we humans can barely recognize. When you're outdoors remember to walk and talk softly, lessening the chance of scaring away the wildlife.
- <u>Dress like Nature</u>: Animals use camouflage, so can you! Dress in browns, greens, and grays to make yourself less obvious to wildlife.
- Stay Away: Frequently we want to get "up close" to wild creatures, but remember that this can cause them to flee or, in rare cases, attempt to defend their territory.
   Maintain a safe distance from the creatures you view at all times.
- Have Fun: Enjoy watching animals and appreciate the incredible moments you get to see when you take the time to look and listen!





Habitat: forests, fields, marshes Diet: small mammals, birds, insects, nuts, berries Range: southern Canada through South America




**River Otter** Lutra canadensis
